

60. Upon the petition of James and Joseph Belches against Edward Marks Exors. &c. of Israel Marks decd. for two pounds and three pence and interest due by account. This day came the plaintiffs by their attorney and the defendant having been duly summoned and serv'd with a copy of the petition and account and not appearing on the motion of the plaintiffs it is considered by the court that they recover against the defendant two pounds and three pence and their costs by them on this behalf expended, to be paid of the goods & chattels of Israel Marks decd. in the hands of the defendant to be administered if so much thereof he hath in his hands to be administered, if not then the costs to be levied of the proper goods and chattels of the defendant.

Upon the petition of Shadrack Lewis guardian to Jesse Larkford orphan of Thomas Larkford decd. against Shadrack Johnson and Wilson Wade for Five pounds due by bond and costs. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the defendants having been duly summoned and serv'd with a copy of the petition and not appearing on the motion of the plaintiff it is considered by the court that he recover against the defendant Five pounds and his costs by him in this behalf expended. But this judgment except the costs is to be discharged by the payment of Two pounds ten shillings with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum from the 31st day of January 1783 till paid

Daniel Fisher comes into court and undertakes for the defendant Etheldred Taylor that in case he shall be cast in this suit he shall pay and satisfy the condemnation of this court or render his body to prison in discharge of the same or that he the said Daniel will do it for him whereupon the said defendant by his attorney prays and has leave to imparle till the next court

William Gray *Petif* In Debt.

This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and Joel Newsum who undertook at the last court as special bail for the defendant brought the body of the defendant and surrendered him here in court, therefore the said Joel Newsum from his undertaking and recognizance aforesaid in this part made is by the court here fully discharged and the defendant committed to the custody of the sheriff. Whereupon the defendant confess'd the plaintiffs action to be just for Forty pounds Virginia money with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of five per centum from the 10th day of July 1783 till paid the debt in the declaration mentioned. Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant Forty pounds Virginia money with interest thereon from the 10th day of July 1783 till paid and his costs by him about his suit on this behalf expended. Whereupon on the prayer of the plaintiff the defendant is charged in custody of the sheriff in execution in discharge of this judgment & costs
