

Pope who made oath according to law giving security. Whereupon the said William Pope with Thomas Edmunds his security entered into land acknowledged their bond in the sum
 of Two hundred pounds for the said William's due and faithful administration
 on the estate of the said decedent, and it is ordered that the said Benjamin Johnson,
 Joshua Johnson & John Pope son of William Pope chairmaker v Nathan Johnson be sum-
 moned to appear at the next court to produce the will of the said Jacob Johnson decd.

Ordered that Arthur Foster, Jacob Barnes, Samuel Edmunds and Nathan Turner or
 any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in
 current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Jacob Johnson decd. and return
 the appraisement to the next court

Ordered that James Bell and two tithables, four slaves total, two horses ten cattle &
 two free tithables between sixteen and twenty one be added to battle. Sommons list of

A release from Joseph & William Scott to John Johnson was acknowledged by the said
 Joseph and William Scott and ordered to be recorded

An indenture of bargain and sale between John Johnson and Leah his wife of the
 one part and Hester Pope of the other part and the receipt thereon endorsed were
 acknowledged by the said John Johnson and Leah his wife she being first prisively
 examined as the law directs and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that Thomas Ridley, Thomas Fitzhugh and Dolphus Drew or any two
 of them examine state and settle an account current of the estate of Littleton Tur-
 ner decd. and make report thereof to this court

Upon the presentment of the grand jury against Icas Kirby, for getting drunk and
 breaking the sabbath at Mary Cobbs on the 8th of this last May. This day came the
 attorney for the commonwealth and the said Icas Kirby, having been duly summoned
 and not appearing or offering any thing in his defense, it is considered by the court that
 the said Icas Kirby make his fine with this our commonwealth by the payment of
 ten shillings to the churchwardens of the parish of Rottenway according to an act of Assembly
 in that case made and provided, and that he also pay the costs of this prosecution

Upon the presentment of the grand jury against Albridge Jones jun^r. for profanely swearing
 two oaths on this ground on the 14th day of April last. This day came the attorney for the
 commonwealth and the said Albridge Jones having been duly summoned and not appear-
 ing or offering any thing in his defense it is considered by the court that the said Albridge
 Jones Jr make his fine with this our commonwealth by the payment of ten shillings to the
 churchwardens of the parish of Rottenway according to an act of Assembly in that case made
 and provided, and that he also pay the costs of this prosecution

Upon the presentment of the grand jury against Miles Bay for profanely swearing two oaths
 at Etheldred Taylor on the 4th day of May last. This day came the attorney for the com-
 munity and the said Miles Bay having been duly summoned and not appearing or
 offering any thing in his defense it is considered by the court that the said Miles Bay make
 his fine with this our commonwealth by the payment of ten shillings to the churchwardens
 of the parish of Rottenway according to an act of Assembly in that case made & provided and
 that he also pay the costs of this prosecution
