Ordered that Luther Foster, Jacob Barnes, Samuel Edmunds and Luther Turner or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace of this county do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Jacob Johnson decd. and return the appraisement to the next court

Ordered that James Bell and two tithables, four slaves total, two horses ten cattle & two free tithables between sixteen and twenty one be added to Bapt. Simmons list of tithables

A release from Joseph & William Scott to John Johnson was acknowledged by the said Joseph and William Scott and ordered to be recorded

An indenture of bargain and sale between John Johnson and Selah his wife of the one part and Hardy Pyle of the other part and the receipt thereon endorsed were acknowledged by the said John Johnson and Selah his wife she being first privately examined as the law directs and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that Thomas Ridley, Thomas Fitzhugh and Dolphin Dvors or any two of them examine state and settle an account current of the estate of Catelet Turner decd and make report thereof to this court
