On the motion of Robert Carr a witness for John Underwood against Matthew Underwood it is Ordered that the said John Underwood pay him Three hundred & Fifty pounds of Testimony for 14 days attendance on this Court according to Law

On the motion of Tom Thomas a witness for Matthew Underwood at the suit of John Underwood it is Ordered that the said Matthew Underwood pay him fifty pounds of Testimony for two days attendance on this Court according to Law

Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiffs recover against the said Defendant his damages aforesaid in form aforesaid & costs together with his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended all be levied of the goods and chattels of the s^r James Taylor at the time of his death in the hands of the defendant to be administered of so much she hath if not then the costs to be levied of the proper goods & chattels of the said Elizabeth Taylor &c in money &c.
