It appearing to the court from the testimony of several witnesses that Lawrence Joiner hath been guilty of several extravagant actions indicating an unsound mind and that he is incapable of conducting the affairs of his family or estate, it is therefore ordered that Arthur Bowring, Lewis Joiner and Joseph Bradshaw be a committee to take care of the said Lawrence Joiners person and estate.

The persons appointed to value the slaves Jeffry, Harry Tom and Peg and state an account between the complainants and defendants of all such matters that may be laid before them, made their report in the following words to wit: Pursuant to a decretal order of the worshipping court of Southampton made in the suit Henry Tillar and others plaintiffs and Byrd Lundy's Esqr. defendants the subscribers had valued the slaves in the order mentioned at such price as they think the said slaves would have sold for in specie at the death of Joshua Bland decd January 1776 as follows viz. Jeffry to £110. Harry £100. Tom £90. Peg £25. £325. also stated the account between the estate of the said Byrd Lundy and the legatees of the said Joshua Bland decd.
