

Ordered that the treasurer of this county pay John Rochelle Eighty pounds for rebuilding the three cy press bridge the persons appointed to view the same having reported that it was completed according to agreement, and account thereof with this court

Thomas Turner produced a commission from the Governor of this state as a Captain of the militia in this county and Moses Foster as an Ensign, took the oath prescribed by law and qualified accordingly.

Ordered that the court be adjourned till to morrow morning 10 o'clock

A court continued and held for the county of Southampton on Friday the 12th day of August 1785.

Ordered that John Simmons, Benjamin Lewis, Benjamin Butts and Moses Foster or any three of them view the conveniencies and inconveniencies attending the turning of a road near Forts bridge and make report thereof to this court

Ordered that John Simmons, Thomas Ridley and William Bricklons or any two of them view the repairs of the courthouse and prison and report whether they are completed according to agreement

William Edwards having obtained an attachment against the estate of Robert Washington who hath privately removed himself or so absconds that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him, Benjamin Blunt Gentleman high sheriff of this county returned the attachment executed and summoned John Powell and William Whitstead garnishees, and the said John Powell being sworn deposed that he had in his possession a negro girl named Cherry, three fourths of which negro are the property of Robert Washington. Therefore on the motion of the plaintiff who proved his demand to be just judgment is awarded him against the defendant for Forty seven pounds fifteen shillings with interest thereon from the 31st day of March 1783 till paid and it is ordered that the sheriff sell the aforesaid negro girl Cherry at public auction for ready money, and that he pay three fourths part thereof to the plaintiff towards satisfaction of this judgment and costs and return an account of his proceedings herein to this court. And the said garnishee not being able to ascertain what money he has in his hands belonging to the defendant this attachment is ordered to be continued.
