James Moore an infant under the age of 21 years by Isaac Williams his guardian and next friend, having obtained an attachment against the estate of Daniel Wood for two pounds eighteen shillings and eight pence ^{costs} together, who hath privately removed himself or so absconded that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him - the sheriff made return that he executed the attachment on three coats, one, a hat, 1 pair of breeches one chest of drawers and had found accounts in the hands of Elisha Milton to the amount of sixteen pounds eighteen shillings and seven pence. Whereupon on the motion of the plaintiff who proved his demand to be just it is considered by the court that he recover against the defendant the aforesaid Two pounds eighteen shillings and eight pence together with his costs by him in this behalf expended.
