in the declaration in manner and form as the plaintiff hath declared against
him. Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the
defendant his said debt and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended
and the said defendant in mercy &c. But this judgment except the costs is to
be discharged by the payment of Three hundred pounds together with interest thereon
to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum from in the following
manner to wit: one hundred pounds with interest from the first day of January 1783 till
paid, one hundred pounds with interest from the first day of January 1784 till paid
and one hundred pounds with interest from the first day of January 1785 till paid.
Whereupon the defendant by John Nesbitt his attorney praying for an injunction subpaena
directed to the plaintiff and all others concerned for stay of all further proceedings upon
this judgment until the ^{same} matter is heard in equity, and the court being fully satisfied
with the matter of equity the same is granted him on his giving bond and security
according to law at the next court.

Arthur Boykin produced a commission from the Governor of this State as a Captain of
the militia of this county and qualified there to according to law.

Ordered that the treasurer of this county pay Hatchcliffe, Boon this county's proportion of
Three pounds for clearing black water bridge and account thereof with the court.
