in the declaration in manner and form as the plaintiff hath declared against him. Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant his said debt and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended 186th and the said defendant in mercy &c. But this judgment except the costs is to be discharged by the payment of Three hundred pounds together with interest thereon to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum from in the following manner to wit: one hundred pounds with interest from the first day of January 1783 till paid, one hundred pounds with interest from the first day of January 1784 till paid and one hundred pounds with interest from the first day of January 1785 till paid. Whereupon the defendant by John Neeson his attorney praying for an injunction subpoena directed to the plaintiff and all others concerned for stay of all further proceedings upon this judgment until the ^{same} matter is heard in equity, and the court being fully satisfied with the matter of equity the same is granted him on his giving bond and security according to law at the next court.

Arthur Boykin produced a commission from the Governor of this State, as a Captain of the militia of this county, and qualified thereto according to law.

Ordered that the treasurer of this county pay Batchello Boon, this county's proportion of Three pounds for clearing back water bridge and account thereof with the court.

26th to 8th This day came the plaintiff by Richard Tello his attorney, and therupon came also a jury to rule. Arthur Turner, Arthur Boykin Edmund Tyler, John Simmons, Samuel Smith, Samuel Ellis, Sterling Francis Howell Edmunds, Samuel Francis, Thomas Hensum, Arthur Doles and John H. Bond who being sworn to enquire what damages the plaintiff hath sustained by the occasion in the declaration mentioned upon their oath do say that the plaintiff hath sustained damages by the occasion thereof to Two pounds eleven shillings and six pence half penny besides his costs. Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the defendant his said damages and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended.

Cost is allowed Two pounds ten shillings for a gun taken from him in the year 1781 and not returned.

On the motion of James Sumner a witness for Edmund Tyler against Arthur Doles it is ordered that the said Doles and Tyler pay him Three hundred twenty five pounds of tobacco for thirteen days attendance on this court according to law.
