


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Joseph Guely who stands bound by recognizance to appear here this day to answer the complaint  
of John Barrow against him for a breach of the peace appeared accordingly Whereupon the said  
John Barrow & Joseph Guely were fully heard On consideration whereof it is ordered that the  
said Guely give security for his good behavior for the space of six months ~~henceforth~~ that he be  
committed to the custody of the sheriff of this county until he shall give such security & thereupon  
the S<sup>t</sup> Joseph with Geo. Guely & Thomas Turner gentleman ~~came~~ into court & acknowledged  
themselves severally indebted to the commonwealth that is to say the said Joseph in the  
sum of fifty pounds and the said George & Thomas in the sum of Twenty five pounds  
each of them respective land and tenements goods and chattels ~~which~~ he had left to the  
commonwealth remised yet upon this condition that of the said Joseph Guely shall be  
of good behavior and keep the peace toward the S<sup>t</sup> John Barrow & all other the citizens  
of this commonwealth for the space of six calendar months next ensuing then this day  
whereupon to be used

= Ordered that the court be adjourned till the Court in Council

At a Court held for the County of Southampton on Thursday the 12<sup>th</sup> day of January 1786  
Present Wm Blunt Jno Simmons Gentlemen

Stirling Francis having obtained an attachment against the estate of Frederick Francis  
who hath privately absconded himself or so absconds that the ordinary process of the law  
cannot be served upon him for £38. 1 4<sup>th</sup> inst due on a bond and the Sheriff having returned  
that he had levied the attachment on a negro fellow named  and the said  
defendant not appearing to reply he attached effects Therefore on the motion of the Plaintiff  
it is considered by the Court that he recover against the said defendant the sum of  
Thirty eight pounds one shilling with interest thereon after the rate of 5% per annum  
from 9<sup>th</sup> day of Jan 1786 till payment together with his costs by him on his behalf  
expenses and it is ordered that the Sheriff sell at public auction (after due notice given)  
for ready money the before mentioned negro with the arising from the sale pay unto  
the Plaintiff the afores<sup>d</sup> judgment cost or so much as the sale amounts to further an act  
of the proceedings to this Court

The last will and testament of Amy Harrison deceased was proved by the oath  
of James Lundy a witness thereto and ordered to be recorded time being  
allowed for the Executor to qualify
