 John Barrow & Joseph Guley were fully heard On consideration whereof it is ordered that the
 said Guley give security for his good behavior for the space of six months ~~himself~~ that he be
 committed to the custody of the sheriff of this county until he shall give such security & Thereupon
 he & Joseph with Geo. Guley & Thomas Turner gentlemen ~~came~~ into court & acknowledged
 themselves severally indebted to the Commonwealth that is to say the said Joseph in the
 sum of fifty pounds and the said George & Thomas in the sum of Twenty five pounds
 each of them respective lands and tenements goods and chattels ~~to be~~ levied to the
 Commonwealth raise up upon this condition that if the said Joseph Guley shall be
 of good behavior and keep the peace towards the S. John Barrow & all other the subjects
 of this Commonwealth for the space of six calendar months next ensuing then this recog-
 nizance to be void

Ordered that the court be adjourned till the Court in Cause

 expended and it is ordered that the sheriff sell at public auction (after due notice given
 for ready money the before mentioned negro twith the ^{money} issuing from the sales pay unto
 the plaintiff the afore said judgment debt or so much as the sale amounts to to fulfil an act
 of the proceedings to this Court

 allowed for the Executor to qualify &
