who proved his account for £19-17-1 to be just And the garnishee appearing
disposing that he was indebted to the defendant £4-17-6 Therefore it
is considered by the court (the defendant not appearing) that the plaintiff
recover against the S^r Defendant the sum of Thirteen pounds seventeen
shillings one pence & his costs by him in this behalf expended & it is
ordained that the defendant pay to the plaintiff four pounds 17/6 toward
satisfaction of his judgment of today
