replevy the attached effects Therefore on the motion of the plaintiff it is considered by
the Court that he recover against the 1st Defendant Ten pounds ten shillings
with interest thereon from the 1st day of January 1786 till pay ment & for his costs by
him in this behalf expended & it is ordered that the sheriff do at fees & charges
after due notice given the aforesd. attached property & with the money arising from the
sale discharge this judgment of 10th or so much thereof as the sale amounts to &
account with the Court for the balance if any
