Ordered that the sheriff of this county summon twenty four of the most capable freeholders of this county not being ordinary keepers, constables, surveyors of highways, owners or occupiers of mills to appear at the courthouse of this county on the second Thursday in May next to be sworn a grand jury of inquest on the body of this county.
