John Wright who stands bound by recognizance to appear here this day to answer the complaint of against him for a breach of the peace, appeared accordingly and the parties being heard, it is ordered that the said John Wright be committed to the custody of the sheriff of this county there to remain unless he shall give sufficient security for his good behaviour for the space of twelve months. Whereupon the said John Wright with William Boykin his security all of this county came into court and acknowledged themselves severally indebted to the commonwealth of Virginia in the sum following that is to say the said John Wright in the sum of Fifty pounds and the said William Boykin in the sum of Twenty five pounds of their respective lands and tenements to be levied
