On the motion of John Cornwall a witness for Rice Bolton Pierce against James Kirk son^r it is ordered that the said Rice B. Pierce pay him one hundred thirty three pounds of tobacco for one day's attendance on this court and travelling and returning thirty six miles according to law.

On the motion of Samuel Ade jun^r a witness for James Kirk son^r at the suit of Rice B. Pierce it is ordered that the said James Kirk son^r pay him one hundred twenty five pounds of tobacco for five days attendance on this court according to law.

On the motion of Samuel Ade jun^r a witness for John Scarbrough an infant by Samuel Hartman his next friend against Benjamin Kirby it is ordered that the said John Scarbrough pay him three hundred twenty five pounds of tobacco for thirteen days attendance on this court according to law.

On the motion of Hardy Dayell a witness for Jesse Bull at the suit of Ethelred Taylor and Daniel Fisher Esq^s & of Henry Taylor Esq^s it is ordered that the said Jesse Bull pay him two hundred twenty five pounds of tobacco for nine days attendance on this court according to law.

Ordered that the court be adjourned till the second Thursday in November next

On the motion of Dolphin Drury and for sufficient reasons appearing to the court his negroes Prince and Glasgow are exempted from the payment of taxes, poor rates and county levies in future

An indenture of settlement between Mills Herring, Anna his wife and Elizabeth Wilson of the one part and William Thomas of the other part and the memorandum of livery of seisin there endorsed were acknowledged by the said Mills Herring and Elizabeth Wilson and witnessed for the joint examination and acknowledgement of Ann Herring

An indenture of bargain and sale between Benjamin Harris and Elizabeth his wife of the one part and Scoville Williamson of the other part was acknowledged by the said Benjamin Harris and with the commission for the joint examination of Elizabeth Harris and certificate of the execution thereof ordered to be recorded

An indenture of bargain and sale between Joseph Reese of the one part and Richard Gillam of the other part was proved by the oaths of John Myrick, John Williamson &
