William Drury having obtained an attachment against the estate of Amos Newsum who hath privately removed himself or so absconds that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him for Thorne pounds nineteen shillings and four pence due by bond the sheriff made return that he had executed the attachment on the hands of John Blunt who appearing before and being sworn deposed that he hath four pounds four shillings in his hands left by Betty Blunt if in consequence of a bond given by one Womble to Moses Newsum for pork belonging to Amos Newsum I ordered that this cause be cont^d at the next court.
