half penny with interest thereon after the rate of 5 p<sup>c</sup>. pt<sup>r</sup> ann<sup>t</sup> from the 28<sup>th</sup> Jan<sup>r</sup> 1786  
till payment according to the condition of the bond afores<sup>d</sup> and for his costs by them on  
this behalf expended

Upon the petition of James Colthorp ex<sup>r</sup> & co of Eleanor Colthorp against J<sup>r</sup> Hancock  
& Elizabeth his wife for four pounds seven shillings and six pence due by act.  
This day came the said James by his attorney & the defendants having been duly  
summoned and com<sup>t</sup> with a copy of the said petition and absent of not appearing  
Therefore to the motion of the plaintiff it is considered by the court that he  
recover against the said Defendants the afores<sup>d</sup> four pounds seven shillings &  
six pence what the plaintiff proved to be justly due to him & his costs by them  
on this behalf expended — Men<sup>r</sup> plff acknowledges satisfaction for £1 18 s<sup>r</sup>

On the motion of W<sup>m</sup> Vaughan a witness for Arthur Turner com<sup>r</sup> & co of Littleton Turner it is ordered  
that the S<sup>r</sup> Turner pay him 925<sup>s</sup> to be for eleven days aleracion on this court according to law
