

Upon the petition of William Barnett against Jordan Brewer and Joshua Whitney Es.  
 of Giles Whiting. This day came as well the plaintiff by his attorney as the debt  
 in their proper persons who confessed that their indebtedness was indebted to the plaintiff Brown  
 for four barrels of corn. Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiffs recover  
 against the said debt <sup>the said three pounds &</sup> his costs by him in this behalf expended to be levied of the  
 goods and chattles of which were of the s.<sup>d</sup> Giles Whiting at the time of his death in the  
 hands of of Jordan Brewer and Joshua Whitney to be administered if so much  
 thereof he hath if not the costs to be made of the proper goods and chattles of the  
 said defendants

Upon the petition of Charles Edmunds assignee of W<sup>m</sup> Edwards against Benj<sup>m</sup> Williams  
 and William Crichton for five hundred pounds of Tobacco & interest due by note. This  
 day came the plaintiff by his attorney & the debt having been duly summoned and  
 served with a copy of the petition and not appearing. Therefore on the motion of the  
 it is considered by the court that he recover against the said debt the amount  
 of five hundred pounds of Virginia inspected crop Tobacco with interest thereon  
 after the rate of 3 p<sup>ts</sup> 100 <sup>and his costs by him in this behalf expended</sup> from the fifth day of December 1782 till paid  
 memorandum February 7<sup>th</sup> 1784 on the bond 160<sup>th</sup> Tobacco  
 10<sup>th</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> 0<sup>th</sup> for 40 Tob<sup>o</sup>

Upon the petition of Charles Edmunds assignee of W<sup>m</sup> Edwards against Isaac Johnson  
 and Jacob Johnson for 4<sup>th</sup> 3 and interest due by note. This day came the plaintiff  
 by his attorney and the defendant Isaac Johnson having been duly summoned  
 and served with a copy of the petition and not appearing. Therefore it is considered  
 by the court that he recover against the said debt Isaac Johnson the amount  
 four pounds three shillings with interest thereon from the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1783  
 till paid and his costs by him in this behalf expended

On the motion of Joseph Roper a witness for Howell Edmunds at the suit of  
 Elizabeth Moore it is ordered that the said Howell pay him four hundred and fifty  
 two pounds of Tobacco for eight days attendance in this court and riding 14 miles 6 times  
 and returning according to law

Ordered that John Thomas Blew es<sup>d</sup> & of R Blew pay to Joseph Roper 25<sup>th</sup> Tobacco for  
 5 days attendance and riding 3 times 14 miles and returning as a witness for him at  
 the suit of John Scott and Thom<sup>s</sup> Scott

It is ordered that Calix Martin pay to Littlebury Mason 200 Tobacco for 5 days attendance and  
 riding 25 miles and returning as witness for her at the suit of John Barrow

Ordered that James Gray pay to Lewis Gray 200 Tol<sup>o</sup> for 5 days attendance  
 as a witness for him against Jeremiah Tyler
