Benjamin Blunt J<sup>r</sup>. produced to the court a list of debts received by him for taxes as the law directs which was sworn to & ordered to be certified

And that Ben<sup>g</sup> Kirby & John Simmons agree with some person or persons to find plank for the Capsunka bridge

The persons appointed to let the repairs of Carrys bridge over Notaway returned their report in these words "In obedience to an order of Southampton county Court bearing date the 1<sup>st</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1786. we the subscribers have let the repairs of Carrys bridge over Notaway river to Thomas C. Butler for Forty three pounds And the same is completed according to agreement. Given under our hands this 14<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1786. signed J<sup>r</sup>. Simmons & John Simmons J<sup>r</sup>."

Whereupon it is ordered that the Treasurer of this county pay Tho<sup>s</sup> Clements Butler the under taker forty three pounds for the same & sent with the books Thomas Stevenson J<sup>r</sup>. who stands bound to appear here for begetting a bastard child in the body of Jane Sumnerdell. This day appeared <sup>on the S<sup>d</sup> Jane also</sup> and the parties being heard it is ordered that the S<sup>d</sup> Thomas be committed to the custody of the sheriff until he find sufficient security for the maintenance of the bastard child & upon whereupon the S<sup>d</sup> Thomas with James Sumnerdell ~~admitted~~ <sup>usually</sup> into Court & acknowledged themselves indebted to the Governor of this Commonwealth for the time being & to his successors in the sums following that is to say the S<sup>d</sup> Thomas Stevenson in the sum of Twenty five pounds current money & the S<sup>d</sup> James Sumnerdell in the sum of Twenty five pounds of their respective goods & chattels to be levied & to the S<sup>d</sup> Governor or his successors under yet upon this condition that if the said Thomas Stevenson shall pay to the owners of the poor the sum of five pounds annually or find sufficient main tainer for the said child for the space of five years when called on by the S<sup>d</sup> Governor then this obligation to be void or else to remain in full force &c

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the next in Course
