as the sale amounts to & return an account of his proceedings to this court

Richard Harrison having obtained an attachment against the estate of Russell Bap who
hath privately removed himself or so absconds that the ordinary process of the law
cannot be served on him for £402. due by and this day came the plaintiff
by his attorney & the defendant not appearing to reply the attached debt. Therefore
on the motion of the plaintiff who proved his a/c to be just it is considered by the
Court that he recover against the defendant the £. four pounds two shillings this
day by him in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that Moses McKinney the garnishee
who deposed yesterday that he was indebted to the defendant in the sum of four
pounds pay the £. five pounds to the plaintiff towards satisfaction of this judgment
& costs.

Richard Harrison having obtained an attachment against the estate of Russell
Bap who hath privately removed himself or so absconds that the ordinary process
of the law cannot be served upon him for £8.17.1 due him by act. This day
came the plaintiff by his attorney and Eliz. Harrison a garnishee in this suit
appeared & deposed that he was indebted to the defendant the sum of ten pounds
and the defendant not appearing. Therefore on the motion of the plaintiff who proved
his a/c to be just it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against
the £. defendant the afores^d. Eight pounds seventeen shillings one Penny &
his cost by him in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that the garnishee
pay to the plaintiff the sum in his hands due on his bond afores^d to the plaintiff
towards satisfaction of this judgment & costs.
