Ordered that Jonathan Wall & Williams Williforce & John Woodcock or any three view Tarpin bridge & Whort

Ordered that the court be adjourned till Court in course

At a court of Oyer & Terminer held at the courthouse on Tuesday the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 17<sup>th</sup> for the trial of Ned a Negroe mans slave belonging to Benjamin Kincaid for feloniously breaking & entering the dwelling house of Ephraim Williams & stealing there out sundry goods to the value of forty shillings on the 16<sup>th</sup> of April last

The prisoner being set to the bar & arraigned as afores<sup>d</sup> & plead not guilty whereupon divers witnesses were examined & the prisoner heard in his own defence on consideration whereof the circumstances of the case it is the opinion of the court (the goods being afores<sup>d</sup> the value of 20<sup>s</sup>) that the prisoner is guilty of felony but intitled to the benefit of clergy & that he now in open court be burnt in the hand which was executed & that he also receive on his bare back 39 lashes and it is ordered that the Sheriff see the same performed
