This day came the parties by their attorneys and thereupon came also a jury to wit Jeremiah Tyler Charles Cosby Williford James Bell John Keeley John Wright W^m Rich^d Loco John Adams Newsum Branch W^m Myrick W^m Hines Jr^l Powell and Howell Briggs who being elected tried between the husband to speak upon the issue joined upon their oath do say that the defendant doth detain the negro boy Will^{am} in the bondage mentioned on manner of man as the plaintiff against him hath complained and they do assess the plaintiffs damages by occasion^{thereof} to one penny besides his costs Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the said slave Will^{am} if to be had if not Fifty pounds the price of the S^r Will^{am} together with his damages assessed^{thereof} on for^{as} assessed^{by him as his loss on this being assessed} to be levied of the goods & chattels of the S^r W^m Whitehead which were at the time of his death in the hands of the defendant to be administered if so much he hath if not the costs to be made of the proper goods & chattels of the said defendant to be in money &c
