

On the motion of Micajah Hallman who made oath according to law administration with the will annexed is granted him on the estate of Arthur Washington dec'd (the executors having refused to qualify and the widow to administer) whereupon the said Micajah Hallman with William Baykin & Samuel Wells his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five thousand pounds for the said Micajahs due and faithful administration on the estate of the Decedent and performance of his will

The last will and testament of John Crenshaw dec'd was proved by the oath of Nicholas Mayet one of the witnesses thereto and having been before proved by the oath of Robert Daugherty another witness is ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Jacob Turner the Executor therein named who made oath according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving security whereupon the sd Jacob Turner with Reuben Whitfield his Security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of two thousand pounds for the sd Turner due and faithful administration of the estate of the said decedent and performance of his will

Ordered James Mayet Samuel Mayet Nowell Whittington & Summish Drake or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves and personal estate of John Crenshaw dec'd and return the appraisement to the next court

An inventory and appraisement of the estate of Henshaw Doyell was returned and ordered to be recorded

An account current of the estate of Henry Baigys dec'd was reported and ordered to be recorded

For reasons appearing to the court the following slaves are exempted from the payment of taxes to wit Venus, Dol, Nell, ^{Lockin} belonging to William Allen Duke belonging to Arthur Turner - Ned and Dinah belonging to Hardy Harris - Phillis Nanny & Toby belonging to Charles Croft - V Nan belonging to Catherine Bannister - Frank to William Francis - Lucy to Thomas Pector - Caesar and Milla to Saml Browne - Jenny belonging to William Thomas

On the motion of Edward Cany & Summish Ellis and for sufficient reasons appearing to the court they are exempted from the payment of taxes

A deed of Gift from Thomas Stephenson senr of the one part to Thomas Stephens of the other part was proved by the oaths of James Lemmell & William Baykin two of the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded

A deed of Gift from Thomas Stephenson to Edmund Stephenson was proved by the oaths of William Baykin James Lemmell & Tho^s Lemmell & the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded
