In re James Mayet Samuel Mayet Howell Whittington & Jeremiah Drake or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves and personal estate of John Cunshaw deceased and return the appraisement to the next court An inventory and appraisement of the estate of Kinchen Doyell was returned and ordered to be recorded

An account current of the estate of Henry Biggs deceased was reported and ordered to be recorded

For reasons appearing to the court the following slaves are exempted from the payment of taxes to wit Venus Dol Nell belonging to William Allen Duke belonging to Arthur Turner Ned and Dinah belonging to Hardy Harris - Phillis Harry & Toby belonging to Charles Cosby - Nan belonging to Catharine Bansay - Frank to William Francis - Lucy to Thomas Peete - Caesar and Millie to Saml. Brown - Jenny belonging to William Thomas

On the motion of Edward Cary & Jeremiah Eller and for sufficient reasons appearing to the court they are exempted from the payment of taxes.

A due of gift from Thomas Stephenson son of the one part & Thomas Stephenson of the other part was proved by the oaths of James Lumsell & William Bayliss two of the witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded

A due of gift from Thomas Stephenson to Edmund Stephenson was proved by the oaths of William Bayliss James Lumsell & Thos. Lumsell & the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded
