June 1784 A writing purporting the last will & testament of Timothy Thorpe deceased having  
been formerly proved in this court and the heir at law having been summonsed to  
contest the validity thereof This day came as well the said heir at law by  
Dan'l Fisher his attorney as the legatees mentioned in the will by their attorney  
and the depositions of sundry having been returned & filed were read & the arguments  
of the counsel on either side being heard on consideration whereof it is the  
opinion of the court that the writing in contestation be established as the  
last will and testament of the s<sup>r</sup> Timothy Thorpe & is ordered to be recorded  
From which adjudication the heir at law by his counsel prays an appeal  
to the next general Court which is granted on his giving bond & security  
duly to prosecute the same — Whereupon a bond was executed in presence  
of the court by Daniel Fisher on behalf of the heir at law <sup>in the sum of one hundred pounds</sup> effectually  
to prosecute the appeal & to secure & pay to the legatees all damages both which  
shall be awarded by the General court

Order'd that the court be adjourned till tomorrow 10 o'clock  
The minutes of these proceedings were signed by Elias Herring  
Foster

securities entered into & acknowledged their bonds on the penalty of Five Thousand  
pounds for the s<sup>r</sup> Jordans due & faithful administration on the estate of the  
deceased & performance of his will

Ordered that Benjamin Blunt Gent: make application to Joseph Scott of  
Nansemond for one shilling yearly as an acknowledgement of the right  
that the justices of the <sup>county</sup> have in the houses built by the s<sup>r</sup> Scott on the  
lands purchased at this place for the use of the s<sup>r</sup> county &

Ordered that the sheriff summon the trustees of the Nottoway Indians to  
appear at the next Court to make up their accounts according to law  
Miles Long is by the court recommended to the Governor as a captain of the  
militia of this county in the room of Benjamin Puffin who has resign'd
