

Henry Thomas having obtained an execution against the estate of Henry Harris who hath privately removed himself or so it seems that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him for a debt due from the said Harris to the said Thomas, this day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the sheriff making return that he had levied the attachment on a negro boy Jacob and the said sheriff not appearing to reply the said attachment properly. Therefore on the motion of the plaintiff it is considered by the Court that he recover against the said defendant £15. 17. 7 & p^{ts} from the 1st day of December 1787 till paid and his costs by him in this behalf expended. and it is ordered that the sheriff seize the attached effects aforesaid and make report thereof to this Court.

The sheriff making return that he had received the attachment on two negroes to wit Isaac and Demus also on Jacob a negro boy who is subject to an attachment of Henry Thomas's and the said defendant not appearing to reply the said attached effects it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff have judgment against him for forty two pounds fifteen shillings with interest thereon from the 1st day of March 1787 till paid and his costs by him in this behalf expended - and it is ordered that the sheriff seize Isaac one of the negroes to answer satisfaction of the judgment and also that the balance in the said sheriff's after satisfaction of Henry Thomas's judgment be applied to the discharge of this and it is further ordered that Mr. Rogers a garnisher make reports to the Court respecting his claim on Demus and that the sheriff summon the said Rogers to appear at the next Court for this purpose and account with the Court for the balance in his hands if any be.
