In confirmation of which it is considered by the Court that the said William Brown pay unto the executors of Wm. Scott dec'd. the aforesaid sum of one pound ten shillings and their Costs by them in this behalf expended

A report about an application made to Joseph Scott by Benjamin Blount for redress for the buildings on the Court House Square was this day returned and which reports follow in these words to wit. Agreed to this order I have on this day applied to Mr. Joseph Scott and demanded one shilling rent for one year for the buildings on this place at the same time informed Mr. Scott that I received that this demand was made in order to bar him absolutely of the said buildings Mr. Scott replied that he should make no acknowledgment until he was convinced that the Court has a right to the land on which the houses were built for that he never knew of any more right than the Court had to the land there was usual and that he thought when first the Court was moved from this place that the land was vacant to the former owner given under my hand at St.ampton Courthouse this 9th day of May 1788 Benjamin Blount
