

subscribers have viewed and measured both the old road and one of the roads lately opened leading from the three creeks to McHenry River, called the fish road, and find the new road forty four yards shorter than the old, also the road leading from Taylors bridge to Southampton & there and find the distance of the new and old road nearly equal. Likewise we have viewed and measured the roads leading from Taylors bridge to Carys bridge and find the new road about three quarters of a mile further than the old road, we are of opinion that the public will sustain little or no inconvenience by turning the two first roads as the ground will be more level than Thomas Turner, one of the petitioners through whose lands the roads at present established past will be greatly relieved and benefited by turning the cart to Carys, the way is more level, but the distance is greater, and we suppose will be injurious to certain individuals resident on the old road, John Taylor, Thomas Vaughan, Samuel Saunders, Whereupon Claudy Wintrop was examined and hearing the parties it is considered by the Court that the prayer of the said petition be granted from which opinion an Appeal is prayed by John Barron to the next General Court on giving bond and security Whereupon the said John Barron with Richard Kells his Security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of fifty pounds, for the said John Barron effectually prosecuting the said Appeal and paying all such Costs and damages as shall be awarded by the said General Court in case the decree of the said Court shall be affirmed.
