

On the motion of Richard Kello treasurer of this County against John Rogers
high Sheriff of the said County for the balance of the tobacco levied for the
use of the County for the years 1785 & 1786 he having acknowledged
legal notice whereof it is ordered that judgment be entered against the
said Sheriff for the said balance & that he pay the costs of this motion.

On the motion of George Gursley for judgment against John Rogers for two
excuses against Dechristian Dunn returned satisfied by the said Sheriff
and not paid to the said Gursley and the said Rogers having acknowledged
that he has had legal notice it is ordered that he have judgment against
the said Sheriff for the amount of the said excuses and that he pay
the costs of this motion.

Baker vs Dorson having obtained an attachment against
the estate of Randolph Urrin who hath privately removed himself or so absconds
that the ordinary process of the law cannot be served upon him for no debt due
the said Baker & Dorson and the Sheriff making return that he had executed
the said attachment in the house of John Whitcher and summoned him as
a garnishee, whereupon this day came the plaintiff who proved his demand to
be just for four pounds four shillings and the said garnishee appearing and
affid that he hath a balance in his hands over the defendant sufficient to cover
two barrels of cut herring now due and a balance on a box sufficient to
recharge the plaintiff demand which was the 15th of May 1789
Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff remain in agnus
the said defendant the said four pounds four shillings and his fees by him
is thus fully repaid and it is ordered that the said garnishee discharge the
same when the balance in his hands becomes due. And it is further ordered
that the Sheriff sell the two barrels of fish and discharge so much of
the said judgment & fees as the sale amounts to and return an account
of his proceedings to the Court.

Ordered that Samuel Jones John Cartaphilus and Edmund Tyler or any
two of them examine stall and settle an account current of the estate of
Moses Johnson dec'd and make report thereof to this Court.
