97-6 Robert Goodwin this day returned an account of taxes for the year 1786 which
was examined by the Court and ordered to be certified

3-97 New Haven Branch this day presented his commission from his Excellency the Governor
of this Commonwealth to be insignd with the militia of this County, whereupon he
qualified accordingly

At a Indenture of bargain and sale between Simon Nick of the part and Richard
Williams of the other part was proved by the oaths of James Bryant Jacob Morris and
John Nick the witness thereto and ordered to be recorded

At a Indenture of bargain and sale between James Edmund and Sally his wife and Julia
Porter of the one part Benjamin Gray of the other part was acknowledged by James
Edmund and Sally his wife and Julia Porter parties thereto the witness being first
privily examined as the law directs and ordered to be recorded

At a Indenture of bargain and sale between John Johnson of the one part and Benjamin
Gray of the other part was proved by the oaths of James Bryant Nathan Barnes
and Jacob Morris witness thereto was ordered to be recorded

The last will and testament of William Brooks deceased was presented in Court by
Michael Warren, Henry Battle and Edward Brantley the executors thereon
named proved by the oaths of John Powell, William Battle and Joseph Gurly
witnesses thereto was ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of the said
executors who made oath according to law certificate is granted them for
obtaining a probate thereof in due form giving security whereupon the said
Michael Warren, Henry Battle and Edward Brantley interebrates and acknow-
ledged their bond in the penalty of two hundred and fifty pounds for the true
and faithful administration on the estate of the said decedent and performance
of his will

Ordered that John Powell, Thomas Holladay, Benjamin Kipps and William
Battle or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this
County appraise in current money the slaves of any and personal estate of
William Brooks deceased to follow the apprasement to this Court
