Harris having obtained an attachment against the estate of
Jones who had previously removed himself or so also consents that the ordinary process
of the law cannot be served upon him for a debt due to the said Harris, and the
sheriff making return that he had executed the said attachment in the hands
of James Isaacson and summoned him as a garnisher who appeared and avowed
that he has two bonds in his hands for fifty two pounds ten shillings and sixpence
the property of the defendants given by Sterling Capell to the said garnisher
therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said
defendant seventy nine pence eight shillings and two pence and interest
thereon after the rate of 5 pence per cent from the 11th day of August 1785
the payment together with his costs, by him in the behalf of the said
order that the garnisher deliver the said bonds to the clerk of this Court, and
that the said Sterling Capell be prohibited from the payment of the money
due on the said bonds till the further orders of this Court. Memorandum
the garnisher on his examinations avows that he assigned one of the bonds of two
hundred pounds five shillings to Mr. Barrow about
