The way came the parties by their attorneys and the persons appointed by a former decree of this Court this day made their report in the following words to wit, I am to certify that in an order of Court bearing date November 7 1787 I was directed to attest and set apart the widows dower of the estate of Thomas Sutton dec^d. and the subscribers have attested and set apart the following shares to wit, Six, & Child per cent and Estate as his share of the above mentioned estate, William Blunt & James Turner. Whereupon it is ordered and ordered that the report aforesaid be made the decree of this Court, and be firm, stable and binding between the parties and that the costs be equally borne among them

An Indenture of bargain and sale between William Sumner and Mrs Bailey of the one part and Charles Bailey of the other part was proved by the oaths of Messrs Branch Mortimer Bailey and Peter Bailey witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded

On the motion of Hannah Gray who made oath according to law for administration on the estate of John Gray dec^d the same is granted her on giving bond and security whereupon the said Hannah Gray with Mary Thomas her security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of four hundred pounds for the said Hannah's due and faithful administration on the estate of the said dec^d.

Ordered that Benjamin Blunt Samuel Francis James Living and Drawing Harris or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace for this County appraise in current money the shares of any and personal estate of John Gray dec^d and return the appraisment to this Court.
