On the motion of Lazarus Cook against James Foster his deputy for
having failed to answer for and pay to the said Lazarus Cook clerks tickets
amounting to seventeen thousand pounds of tobacco at 12/6 p.^a Ct. for which
he gave his receipt to the plaintiff, the defendant being called in his proper
person came and consented that judgment should be entered against him
for the aforesaid seventeen thousand pounds of tobacco at 12/6 p.^a Ct. therefore
it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said
defendant the said seventeen thousand pounds of tobacco at 12/6 p.^a Ct.
and his costs by him in this behalf expended. When? By consent of the
parties and a part of the Court the following rule was entered that all just
costs be allowed against this judgment

C. and Matthew Britte, Thomas Vaughan, Jeremiah Tyler, Lemuel Hunt
Maule Edmunds jr. William Spring, Sterling Capell and Lewis Logner
who being elected tried and sworn the verdict so speak upon the issue joined
upon this is to wit, saying that the defendant hath not paid the debt nor
the satisfaction in manner and form as against him the plaintiff hath
complained. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff
recover against the said defendant four pounds nine shillings and
four pence together with his costs by him in this behalf expended

On the motion of the defendant to now set aside the plaintiff in
this cause the Court takes until the April Court next to consider the
matter
