This day came the parties by their attorneys, and the cause sent back by the Lord's Court for a rehearing of the same, and thereupon came also a jury (testors) John Rogers, (called Foster Milburn) Guillem Simon, Robert Barnaby Drake, Morry Kirby, William Jarrrell, John Adams, Jeremiah Tylor, James Bennett, Burwell Rawlings and Jacob Newsum who being et oia toris and sworn the truth to affirm upon the issue joined (the plaintiff by his attorney) offered in support of his claim sundry depositions to which the defendant accepted on hearing of the parties by their attorneys the defendant's depositions are overruled whereupon the said defendant by his attorney filed his bill of exceptions (in writing) upon their oath as say that the defendant doth sustain the charges Simon and Oliver in the declaration mentioned as against them the plaintiff hath complained and that he hath sustained damages by occasion thereof to fifty pounds besides his costs. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant the said charges Simon and Oliver as also his damages assessed in form aforesaid assessed and his costs by him about his suit in this behalf expended and the defendant in mercy &c. On the motion of the defendant by his attorney for a new trial parties heard and motion overruled & then prayed an appeal which is granted him on his giving bond and security at the next Court &c

On an Injunction

By consent of the parties the depositions of Henry Kirby Robert Goodwyn and James Bell were taken in Court and the cause heard on the bill and answer depositions and arguments of the Counsel on both sides on consideration whereof the Court decreed that the injunction be made perpetual except as to sixty pounds, twenty pounds of which the interest to commence from the 1st day of January 1784, the other twenty pounds to carry interest from the 1st day of January 1785 and the last twenty pounds to carry interest from the 1st day of January 1786 till paid, and it is ordered that plaintiff pay unto the said
