

Daniel Simmons comes and undertakes that if the defendant shall be condemned in this action at the suit of the plaintiff he shall satisfy the condemnation of this court or render his body to prison in discharge thereof or that he the said Daniel Simmons will as it for him wherupon the said Daniel delivered up the Defendant in Custody of the Sheriff and thereas a Defendant confessed the plaintiffs action just for Twelve Pounds fifteen Shillings the debt in the declaration mentioned therefore on the motion of the plaintiff by his attorney it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against this said Defendant twelve pounds fifteen Shillings and his costs by him about his suit with his behalf repaid and the said defendant in mercy &c but this judgment is to be discharged by the payment of Six Pounds seven Shillings with interest from the nineteenth day of August 1798 till payment.

Ordered that the court be adjourned till tomorrow nine o'clock.
