

In conformity to an order of the court of Southampton County, made in September 1801. We the subscribers being three of the persons named in said order have examined the papers produced to us by the parties named in the said order mentioned, and after mature consideration are of opinion that the said goods of the said mine, in and a one and fifty pounds of Tobacco was discharged in October 1783 and we are of further opinion that the balance of fourteen pounds twelve Shillings and seven pence is justly due from the estate of John Blouard & Co to the estate of Henry Harrison & Co with interest thereon from the 5th day of June 1789 being the full balance in the bond given by the said John Blouard & Co with Richard Blouard his security, to Nathaniel Harrison guardian of said Henry Harrison & Co for eight pounds each, dated annually December the 5th 1788 payable in a man & William Henry Benjamin Pate and James C Bailey - February 3rd 1802

Therefore it is considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendants the aforesaid sum of fourteen pounds twelve Shillings and seven pence and interest from the 5th day of June 1789 till paid and her costs by him about this suit in this behalf expended and the defendant in mercy &c &c
