each lot of negroes of equal value. Witness our hands this 19th day

Simmons. When upon it is agreed and ordered that the report
of mesne be made the decree of the court and be firm stable and
binding between the parties and that the costs be equally born between
them.

On the motion of John Nugent who made oath according to law for
administration on the estate of Joseph Britt dec^d (John being having
refused to qualify by a writing under his hand and seal) the same
is granted him on his giving bond and security. When upon the
said John Nugent with William Bailey his security entered
into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of four thousand
dollars for the said John and his faithful administration on the
estate of the said decedent.

An Indenture of bargain between William Spry and Ann his
wife of the one part and Benjamin Drew of the other part was
acknowledged by William Spry and Ann his wife she being
first privately examined and the said indenture ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that Solomon Holmes Jacob Turner Timothy Atkinson and
Wiley Bowers or any three of them being first sworn before a justice
of the peace for this County as appraisers in current money the slaves
of any and person or estate of Joseph Britt and return the appraisement
to the next Court
