"of the said decedent; and also the estate which has been brought in
"Notch pot by the said heirs, the administrators of the decedent having
"kept in their hands such of the estate as was more immediately per-
"tinent To Benjamin Blunt, the lands which his father had parts into
"his possessions previous to his death to the amount of seven hundred
"and thirty four acres, which is bounded by the known and ancient
"standing lines of the tract of land whereon the said Benjamin now
"lives, reference to the several deeds of Sale and conveyances of the said land
"to the said decedent, and to the said Benj^r being had, will make the same
"fully appear; together with thirteen Slaves namely, Faith, Jacob, Esther,
"Sybil, Molly, Anthony, Jacob, Sampson, Israel, Violet, Dinah, Jo-
"and Rachel, and whereas the lands of the said decedent could not well be
"divided off into equal lots or divisions, we have further attested to the said
"Benjamin the sum of Eight hundred and twelve pounds, ten Shillings
