This day came the parties by their attorneys and
messrs appointed by a former decree of this court made their re-
port in the following words to wit. In obedience to the writ or order
of the worshipful court of Southampton County, held in the
month of January 1803 we have proceeded to divide the slaves
whereof Ann Jaur was seized and possessed as follows. To Eliz Jaur
we have allotted Moses, Charles Roger, Sarah, and Cherry T. Abing-
don Jaur & Dempsey, Jacob, Nancy and Suky and to receive
from her sum of £1000, which sum the said Elizabeth is to pay, before
she can have the 18th day of April in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and three. Matthew Calvert, William
Morgan and John Pledger Commissioners.

Whereupon it is ordered and adjourned that the report of the said commissioners be made the same of
the next and forenoonable and ensuing term the parties and the court to be
present and to give judgment among them.
