

George Guseley against William Chambliss administrator of Joseph Fort the persons appointed to settle all matters have appeared in this suit herein the parties reported as follows that there appears due from the estate of Joseph Fort acc^{ts} to George Guseley a balance of Fifty eight pounds two shillings and five pence But the said William Chambliss acc^{ts} of Joseph Fort represents the refusal that he claims it will be in his power to produce proof that the said George Guseley sent or some of his other agents did receive within the bounds land of the said Joseph Fort taxes and levies from same individuals in the year 1796 but are included in the charges exhibited by George Guseley against the estate of said Fort of which are one of opinion that the said William Chambliss legally proceeds after such reception that the same ought to be deducted from the said said balance

No persons appearing to take administration on the estate of said Chambliss acc^{ts} therefore it is ordered that the sheriff of this county take the same into his hands and administer it according to Law

Ordered that Benjamin Kirby Thomas Britts and John Reiffin or any two of them let the repairing of the bridge over the Appamoosee swamp and make report thereof to the Court Ordered that the sheriff of this county pay to Benjamin Kirby John Johnson, John and William and Harris Hornum four Pounds Five shillings and six pence each for serving as a patrol on eight days and hours that is to say June 7th 1802 twelve hours June 12th twelve hours July 12th nine hours August 7th twelve hours September 14th twelve hours September 21st twelve hours October 12th twelve hours each
