shall direct. It also appears to the said commissioners that there is
no objection to wit Henry and Aggy that are too old and infirm
to be considered the division of the said estate and by the consent
of William Briggs and Harry Briggs who have agreed
to keep and support the said negroes without any expense to
the said estate we have therefore declined making any dis-
tribution of said negroes. Given under our hands this 18th
December 1801. Robert Grosvenor Charles Briggs and
William Hines.

Whereupon it is ordered and decreed that the report aforesaid be
made the decree of the court and be firm stable and binding
between the parties and that the costs be equally borne among them
The Indenture of bargain and sale between Daniel Simmons of the one
part and Joseph Precory of the other part was acknowledged by
Daniel Simmons the party thereto and ordered to be recorded
