 and performance of her will

Ordered that Samuel Francis Willard (Bethu Thomas Dacey
 and Northampton Ellis or any three of them being first sworn
 before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in
 money the Slaves if any and personal estate of the said Ann Vaughan
 and return the appraisement to the Court

Ordered that Randolph Newman Richard Clements
 Parker and William Myrick or any three of them being first sworn
 before a justice of the peace for this county do appraise in money
 the Slaves if any and personal estate of John Gasper and
 return the appraisement to the Court

An Indenture of bargain and sale between Jacob Barnett
 the one part and Henry Barnett Henry Barnes Esq. and
 Nathaniel Brett and Co. as Proprietors the other part was made
 - bearing date the 1st day of March 1764 the party thereto and ordered to be
 recorded

An Indenture of bargain and sale between Jeremiah Dacey
 of the one part and Solomon Cobb of the other part was made
 - known by Jeremiah Dacey the party thereto and ordered
 to be recorded

Ordered that the overseers of the poor for the law ward of the
 - town parish bind out Fortune James a black child to
 Eliza Lewis according to Law
