 deceased the dowry of Lucy Simmons and dowry of the Simmons
 in the lands of said Thomas Simmons dec'd; and assigned
 moiety to John Breckinlaw in right of Daniel Simmons
 and debiting sell the other moiety to the highest bidder
 after giving due notice and half an acre of the same
 the other half as is credit of eight hundred and ten pounds
 of the purchase with security payable to the Commissioners
 such half of the amount payable within six months & the remaining
 half payable in eight months and that the commissioners
 of said view the improvements made on the said lands
 by John Breckinlaw and make reports of the amount thereof
 in order to a final decree.

Ordered that the cause be adjourned for half past

At a court held for county of Southampton the 28th
 day of September 1803 for the examination of Thomas
 Griffith charged with being feloniously seized and
 carried out of this state a free negro girl named Charity
 who was emancipated by Lydia Holland of New Kent
 by her last will which was duly recorded in the Court
 of said County
