

At a court held for the county of Southampton on the 1st day of December 1800

The last will and testament of Benj^r & Blount dec^d was presented into court by Richard Blount and Benj^r Blount, two of the executors thereof named and proved by the oaths of John Maclean one of witnesses thereof who also deposed that he saw said Blount and Benj^r Blount (John) sign the same at the request of the said Benj^r Blount dec^d and ordered to be read and on the motion of the said executors who were oath according to law certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form and the giving bond (the will directing no security to be taken) whereupon the said Richard Blount and Benj^r Blount and each into a chain and a thousand on the penalty of one hundred thousand dollars for their due and faithful administration on the estate of the said dec^d and performance of his will -

A Deed of gift between Denmy Powell of the one part and Newman of the other part was fully proved by the oaths of Benj^r Blount &c who also deposed that he saw Benj^r Blount, his wife, and James Wall who he hath married out of the state sign this writing at the request of Denmy Powell and having been before proved by the said Benj^r Blount is now ordered to be recorded -

An Indenture of bargain and sale between Mary^e Denmy and her wife of the one part and Thomas Gray of the other parties provided by the oaths of Joseph Wuffen and Charles Bayly, two of the witnesses thereof and having been before proved by the oaths of Richard Wren and each the commissioners for the conveyance of Mr. Denmy and certificate of its execution it is ordered to be recorded
