Levin Washington Camp<sup>r</sup> } In Chancery

This day came the parties by their attorney and the  
 persons appointed by a former process of the Court this day made  
 the report in the following words (to wit) In obedience  
 to an order of the Worshipful Court of Chancery, to us directed  
 and signified there is made a division of the land of William  
 Washington deceased between Joseph Washington Sen<sup>r</sup> & Lewis  
 Washington widow of the said William Washington de  
 ceased and her heirs and heirs divided and laid off the  
 share of the said Levin Washington as follows beginning  
 at a marked plum tree on the on the west side of the plant  
 orchard, thence a straight line of marked trees to a sweet gum  
 on the north side of the haw bottom then waling the haw  
 bottom to the mouth of the long branch then waling the  
 branch a dividing line between the said William Washing  
 ton and a marked pine thence a straight line to the plant  
 trees the beginning given under our hands the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of  
 March 1803 Thomas Camp Harry Doyles Par  
 Washington

Whereupon it is decreed and ordered that the report of  
 said be made the decree of the Court and be firm stable  
 and binding between the parties and that the cost be  
 equally borne among them
