An Indenture of bargain and sale between Francis Miller one  
of the one part and Robert Maby of the other part was proved by  
the oaths of James Drury Robert Maby and John Mason three  
of the witnesses thereto and over to be recorded

On the motion of Robert Maby for leave to keep an ordinary to  
Harvey's elation on the road leading from Jerusalem to Hickory  
the same is granted him on his giving bond and security whereupon  
the said Robert Maby with his security  
entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of one  
hundred and fifty dollars for the said Robt. Maby's keeping the said  
ordinary according to law

Richard P. Clements and Henry Briggs Justices came into court &  
qualified as justices of the peace for this county as also in Chancery  
according to law

Samuel Cammels one of the executors named in the last will and  
testament of Bray Whitton died this day appeared and gave bond  
in the penalty of one hundred thousand dollars for the said  
Samuel's due and faithful administration on the estate of  
the said deceased and performed of his office

James Fryant this day appeared and qualified as an attorney  
in the County Court of Hampton according to law  
Felix Samkello & Robert Maby
