could at this time divide the proceeds of said sales as by the

Whereupon it is decreed and ordered that the report aforesaid
be made the decree of this Court shall be firm stable & binding
between the parties and that the cost be equally borne among
them

On the motion of Charles Simmons a writt of habeas corpus of the Com-
monwealth against Elizabeth Widdow it is ordered that the
sheriff of this county pay him two dollars and twelve cents for
four days attendance on this Court according to Law

On the motion of Jacob Barnes for leave to keep an ordinary
at Joseph Vicks (Brazzard) on 20th of Nov. 1803 the same is
granted him on his giving bond and Security Whereupon the said
Jacob Barnes with his security
entered into and acknowledges their bond in the penalty of one
thousand and fifty dollars for the said Jacob Barnes
keeping the said ordinary according to Law

Ordered that the Overseers of the poor for the upper district
