This day came the parties by their attorney and the persons
appointed by a former decree of this court this day made their report in
the following words to wit) Shew a decree and order of the worshipful court
of Southampton bearing date the tenth of April 1802 which subscribing
have all read and set apart the records now in the hands of
Simon Pope as a deed and property in the following manner (viz)
Sixty five acres and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a gum in the
roddy branch thence down the branch to a slash in James Barnes line thence
along the said Barnes line to a post oak, a new dividing corner thence
along a line of new marked trees to the beginning - and have sold, two
thirds of the residue at public sale for a credit of three months of
which sales we have with receipt of one hundred and thirty seven of said
is Augustine Pope for the sum of five hundred and seven dollars and
thirty four cents we have also taken the order of said Court and
paid the bond for the above sum of five hundred and seven dollars and
thirty three cents into six equal parts and have paid unto Augustine Pope
his proportion of fifty seven dollars and seventy two cents unto Mostly Pope his propo-
tion of fifty seven dollars and seventy two cents unto William Pope guardian to Simon
Pope and Nancy Pope their proportion one hundred and seventy two dollars
and forty four cents unto Augustine Pope guardian to Simon and James
Pope their proportion one hundred and seventy two dollars and forty four
cents thence and the sum of five hundred and seven dollars and thirty four
cents and have taken their receipt in full for the bond so paid, which
receipts accompany this report Given under our hands this 22nd day of Dec

to sell and divide the lands of Simon Pope etc. two bonds given by
Pope for the sum of one hundred and seventy two dollars of fifty four cents
