William Pope et al. vs. Simon Pope et al. C. P. C.

This day came the parties by their attorney and the persons  
appointed by a former decree of this court this day made their report in  
the following words (to wit) Under and seal of order of the said chief court  
of Southampton bearing date November fifteen 1803. where the subscribers  
have allowed and set apart the monies recover in the law suit of  
Simon Pope and seized and possessed in the following manner (viz.)  
Sixty five acres and bounded as follows (so w<sup>t</sup>) Beginning at a gum in the  
rody branch tree down the branch to a stake in James Barnes line then  
along the said Barnes line to a post oak a new growing corner thence  
along a line of new marked trees to the beginning and have sold two  
thous of the revenue at public sale for a sum of twelve months of  
which sales as herewith reported to one hundred and six dollars and  
to Augustine Pope for his sum of five hundred and seventeen dollars and  
thirty two cents we have also under the said decree and order of said Court exec-

uted the bonds for the above sum of five hundred and seventeen dollars and  
thirty two cents into six equal parts and have paid unto Augustine Pope  
his proportion eighty six dollars and twenty two cents unto Nuttly Pope his pro-  
portion eighty seven dollars and twenty two cents unto Martin Pope his proportion  
Pope and Nancy Pope their proportion one hundred and twenty two dollars  
and forty four cents unto Augustine Pope quantum to Nancy and James  
Pope their proportion one hundred and seven dollars and forty four  
cents from and the sum of five hundred and seventeen dollars and thirty two  
cents and have taken their several receipts for the same, which  
receipts accompany this report given under our hands this day of Decr
